1.	Call To Order & Roll Call	Committee Chair, E. Krygier, called the meeting to order at 5:00 pm.	On motion of C. Maillette and support of E. Krygier, R. Luce was excused. The motion passed unanimously.
2.	Public Input (Maximum of 3 Minutes)	There were not any members of the public present.	
3.	Clinical Program Review 3.1) Vocational Services, N. Sweet	3.1) N. Sweet provided an update on vocational services noting the vocational providers are Do-All, Inc., New Dimensions, and Arenac Opportunities, Inc. (AOI). N. Sweet reported the Individual Placement Support (IPS) reviews have been completed for all providers. IPS is an evidence-based practice and has been a focus at the state level. N. Sweet gave a brief update on the services each provider is currently offering, the referrals process, the collaborative with Michigan Rehabilitation Services (MRS), and the expansion of New Dimension offering services in Arenac County. N. Sweet also reported all providers are expanding community living support (CLS) services. There were general discussions regarding the financial history and impacts of COVID, the cash match agreement, and the status of the janitorial services arrangement between the Opportunity Center and North Bay.	3.1) No action was necessary

Maillette and support of E. Krygier, the clinical privileges for Heather Nix, PhD-LP, were referred to the full Board for approval. The motion was adopted unanimously.

	New Business 6.1) Arenac County Narcan Machine Redeployment Update, J. Hahn	6.1) J. Hahn reported the Narcan machine acquired for Arenac County needs a new location. The machine is too large for the Arenac County Sheriff's Department. Administration is researching other options such as St. Mary's Ascension. The resupply plan is in place. There were general discussions regarding athlete Emmit Smith's advocacy for Narcan and a possible collaborative in Bay and Arenac Counties for increasing public relations.	6.1) No action was necessary
	6.2) Outpatient Therapy Expansion Update, J. Hahn	6.2) J. Hahn reported BABH has a new supervisor for outpatient therapy services and reviewed therapist staffing. Five groups are ready to begin. The goal of implementing internal group therapy is to alleviate pressure from the network providers during this staffing crisis.	6.2) No action was necessary
6.	6.3) General Fund Plan Update, C. Pinter	6.3) C. Pinter reviewed the revenue funding streams for Medicaid, Healthy Michigan, Autism, and General Fund (GF) dollars. C. Pinter reported GF expenses are trending upward due to Medicaid enrollment changes since COVID, the high demand on outpatient therapy, the lack of mental health providers, and the increased awareness of mental health wellness. During the budget approval process the Board agreed to spend \$1M of the fund balance to cover GF expenses to balance the budget. The GF expenses are currently trending at \$700-800,000 over revenue. It is anticipated that third party insurance billing and local revenue will help to cover this variance. J. Hahn also reported Medicaid re-enrollment issues due to a glitch in the state's database determining eligibility and the COVID incentive payments effecting the amount of an individual's spenddown. There were general discussions regarding the state requirements, intricate funding restrictions, the community mental health systems being stretched thin, spenddown amounts, and private pay/third party insurance revenue.	6.3) No action was necessary
